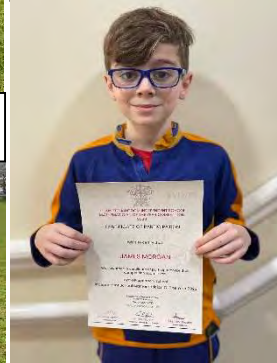


Inter house Rugby Winners: Champion!
